It is great to relax but do try and remember to:

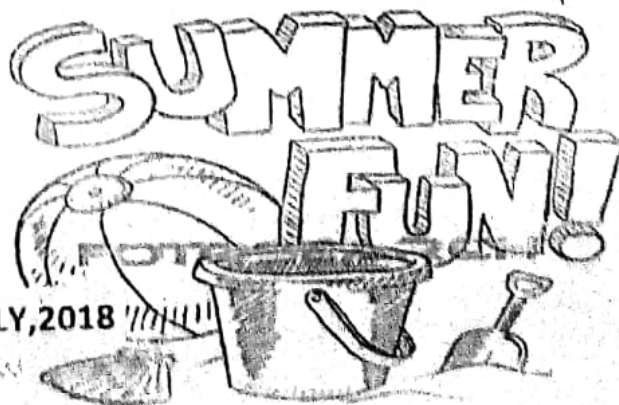
- Follow a routine

Moral: Be friendly and help others.

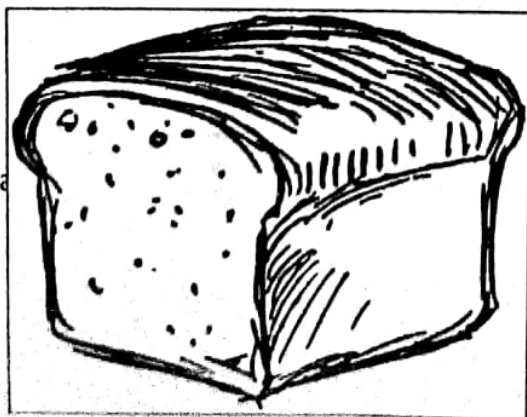
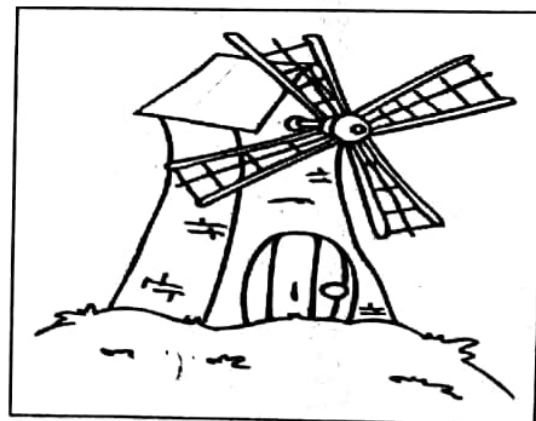
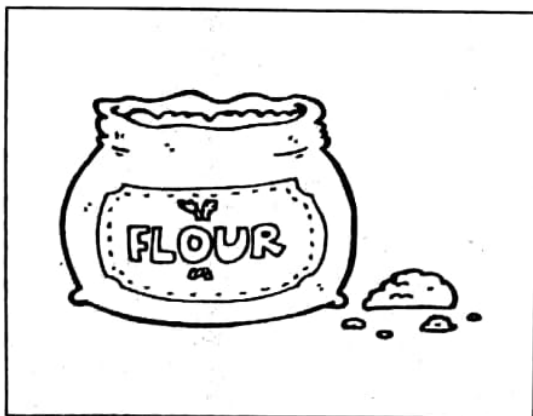
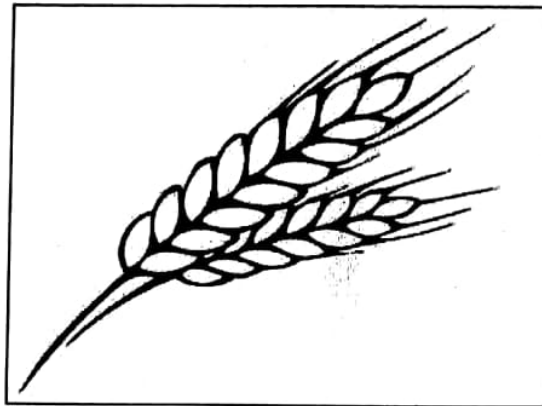
Activity 2

Visit a flour mill with your parents and find out how the wheat is treated once it is taken out of the fields. Discuss what you saw and share your experience with your parents.

Activity 7

The little Red Hen baked bread with the flour.

Would you like to know what your mom/dad do with the wheat flour after they get it from the mill?

To find out go to the kitchen in your house and ask them to show.

Now help them to knead the dough and roll it into a chapatti with a rolling pin. Were you able to roll it into a circle?

Activity 8

Now that you know what your parents do with the wheat flour, find out what other things are prepared with the wheat flour.

Draw/Paste the picture of things that can be prepared using the wheat flour in your EVS notebook.

Activity 9

Listen to the story of the Little Red Hen again and answer the following in your English notebook:

1. What did the little red hen grow? Draw the picture.
2. Draw and write the names of animals that did not help the little red hen.

Activity 10

Activity 11

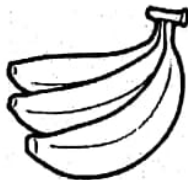
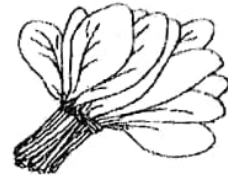
Cut a lady's finger, lemon or bitter gourd and dip it in poster color. Use it to make pretty cards for your loved ones.

Let's learn a little more about the food we eat.

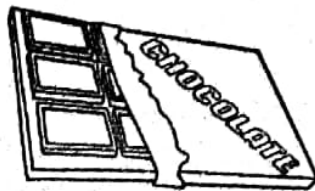
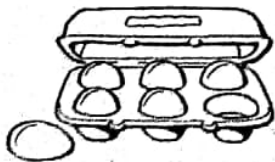
There are three categories of food. The first category is the food that we eat raw, without cooking.
